





FIRST READING


Acts 9:26-31





Hello St. Mary Magdalene,

I pray that the joy of this Easter season and the Resurrection of our Lord abides deep in your heart! I write today as a bit of a follow-up to my February 2, 2024, State of the Parish address (you can find that video here: https://youtu.be/4DFV41k4gm4). In that video I gave a brief overview of our financial status and how we are doing as a parish. As a result of that video, I had two families approach me wanting to help our parish by pledging to match financial gifts.
