This is PART 2 of an update on the Revival at our parish. Part 1 was posted in the last 2 weeks of the bulletin - if you missed it, I gave an update on the first 2 pillars of the Eucharist Revival here at St Mary Magdalene - please go back and read the first half of this update online. Here are updates on our last 2 pillars. Just to recap for those who may not be aware, the *Eucharist Revival* is taking place at every parish across the country, backed by our Bishops, and driven by the need to get back to the basics of some of our teachings, namely the **True Presence of Christ in the Eucharist** and our need for a **personal relationship with Jesus**. Please continue to join us for the ongoing opportunities that are focused through the end of this year:

<u>3. Reinvigorate worship</u> – the invitation is to consider our worship space and how we can beautify it, engage our senses, and teach basics about the mass and sacraments so that everyone can better enter into worship with Jesus instead of just going through the motions.

**Our response**: staff and volunteers have continued to evaluate the colors & decorations of the season, discuss the music, use of incense and sacred silence, ensuring we provide balance and communicate intent to all parishioners so that all who come to worship at St Mary Magdalene can enjoy and enter into the liturgy. The Mass teaching series (in the red box above) is also in response to this. **4. Missionary Sending** – the idea behind this pillar is "what would happen if we all invited one person back?" and "how do we accompany those in need and on the margins?" This is true discipleship and being Jesus' hands and feet in this world.

**Our response**: a lot of this one is still to come. We will be giving resources for how to engage those who have left the Church to find out their stories to encourage healing. We will also be hosting "welcome back" events where specific masses and studies will be welcoming and informative for those who have been away so we can feel comfortable inviting our friends and family back. In the meantime, consider joining our OCIA team - we have over 50 people in the process of considering or actively going through steps to join the Church - find out how you can be a part of their journey by coming to our OCIA Team Informational Night on Mon, May 20th at 6pm or if you can't make it - contact me directly. Also: conversation, prayer and adoration is a great place to engage someone who isn't ready for mass.






#### **PROFESSION OF FAITH**






