How is the Eucharistic Revival going?

It seems timely to give an update on the Revival since I hosted a kick-off for our parish back in January where I explained the purpose of the Revival and the 4 pillars we planned to roll-out. We have accomplished a lot already! For those who may not be aware, this Revival is taking place at every parish across the country, backed by our Bishops, and driven by the need to get back to the basics of some of our teachings, namely the **True Presence of Christ in the Eucharist** and our need for a **personal relationship with Jesus**. Please continue to join us for the ongoing opportunities through the end of the year:

<u>1.Robust Faith Formation</u> – the invitation is to provide opportunities to deepen understanding in the Bible and our Catholic faith through structured teaching.

Our response: First, several teachings on the Eucharist were planned. We hosted a small group video study about Jesus and the Eucharist in Feb/Mar. The next series offered will be "The Mass" in May/Jun - details are in the RED BOX above. Our VBS theme is also based on the Eucharist so our children will also be drawn into this central truth of our faith. Second, our online and print communications have provided teachings on the Eucharist. We have a new webpage dedicated to the Revival where new video links & articles are posted frequently about the Eucharist (see the link above). The bulletin has (this) dedicated page that lists upcoming events and articles about the Eucharist. Lastly, we will have a special offering around *Advent: "Called & Gifted Retreat & Discernment"* – this is over 6-weeks and helps participants to discern the gifts of the Holy Spirit and how we can achieve our greatest joy by learning our purpose in living out of our charisms given at Baptism and Confirmation.

2.Personal Encounters – the invitation is to provide more opportunities for people to hear testimonies and have close encounters with Christ in the Eucharist.

Our response: we have had monthly "revival nights" since February which are special holy hours that have included testimonies from Fr. Chris and parishioners. Please join us for the next revival nights listed in the YELLOW BOX above.
